Project Focus:

- A number of the priorities above are being worked on as part of the cities comprehensive plan up date which is almost complete.
- A Library committee has been active for several years and will soon be launching a fund drive for that facility.
- The HCP Team will meet in September 2003 to decide on which priorities will be tackled over the next year.

Grants/Loans secured

- \$10,000 HCP grant (2002)
- \$1,900 for Children’s Library Program, Andersons Brothers (2007)

Key Accomplishments:

- Over 150 participants attended the Visioning session (June 2002).
- Five focus workshops were held in the areas of Environmental Protection, Government Regulations, Community Facilities and Transportation, Land Use and a further follow-up meeting on land use and public facilities. (June - Oct. 2002).
- Draft comprehensive plans have been distributed to all concerned city commissions and the city council for feedback and have been rewritten by the HCP team in preparation for the open house and public hearing to be held June 28th 2003 but has not been adopted as of May 2006.
- Comprehensive plan adopted by City Council. (2008)
