



Pine County Statistical Data

Demographics

Pine County has seen a **POPULATION INCREASE** of 32% between 1990 and 2007 adding 6,900 people for a 2007 population of 28,164. The population is projected to grow an additional 7.8% by 2010.

- The county has an **older than average** population with 15.3% being 65 or older.
- 7.6% of the population is **ethnically diverse**, compared to an average for our region of 5.7% and the state at 14.1%.
- As of 2000 only 10.3% of the population has a **bachelor's degree or higher** which is below average for the region (15%) and considerably lower than the state average (27.4%).
- **Mean travel time** to work was 30.2 minutes which is above average in our region (25.9 average mean) and much higher than the state mean of 21.9.
- 2004, **median household income** was \$39,663 which is significantly lower than the state median income (\$51,202) and the IF regional average (\$46,682).
- The 2004 **poverty rate** was higher than average in the region at 10.5% compared to the IF regional average of 8.4% and the state average of 8.1%.

The annual **UNEMPLOYMENT RATE** was 6.5% in 2006 and 9.0% in 2008, compared to an IF Region rate of 7.6% and a state average of 6.8%.

From 2002 to 2007 the number of **FARMS** had decreased by 21.2% as the amount of total acreage had also decreased by 1.7%. The value of production had increased by 44.5% compared to an increase in the IF region of 43.4% and a 53.7% increase in the state.
